## NJ Officials Issue 2011 Expected State Plan Benefit Increases

On July 14, 2010, the commissions that manage the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP) and the School Employees' Health Benefits Program (SEHBP) announced their intended rate increases beginning January, 2011. Click <a href="here">here</a> for the web page that illustrates the preliminary evaluations and the expected rate increases. The SHBP applies to participating local governmental units. The SEHBP applies to local school districts and county colleges. New Jersey governmental and public educational entities have the voluntary ability to procure their employee benefits through these two separate plans or purchase coverage through the private market or via a joint insurance fund.

In January, 2010, the educational units received a 25% increase while governmental units received an 18% increase. Below are the rate increases summarized by plan as of January 2011:
